# WELCOME TO EMERALD

Welcome to the Emerald Cultural Institute. We are all very excited to welcome you to our wonderful city and to help you make the most of your stay by experiencing the best of Dublin.

This handbook should provide you with all the relevant information you may need for your stay in Ireland, however please don't hesitate to ask if you have any questions.

## YOUR ARRIVAL

In the airport you should follow the signs to the arrival hall, where a member of the transfer team will have an Emerald sign with your name. The airport can be very busy and if you do not immediately locate your driver, please wait at the Meeting Point in the arrival's hall and one of our staff will find you. You will be brought directly to the residence, where you will be assigned your room and given your key card. You will be given a lanyard which will allow you to carry both your room key and all contact numbers on you at all times. Depending on your arrival time you can join one of the scheduled tours of the campus which shows you everything you need to know about your meals, your activities, laundry, etc. On the first Monday morning, after your breakfast, you will meet our staff at an assigned time and location on campus. One of our team will either bring you to the school for your test or you will be accompanied on a city centre orientation.



## YOUR FIRST DAY

You will have an English test so we know exactly what your level is and can place you in the correct class.

You will be given an Emerald student card which has your name on it and also the details of the residence and of the school. It is very important to keep this with you at all times.





## WHAT IS EXPECTED OF YOU

**Respect** - Students must treat all staff, members of the public and each other with respect at all times.

**Please And Thank You** - Students must remember to be courteous and show good manners to staff, catering staff, members of the public and each other.

**Speak English** - Students are expected to try to speak English at all times whether you are talking to people of the same or different nationalities.

---

**No Bullying** - Bullying is the deliberate and/or repeated action of making another person unhappy. Bullying of any nature will not be tolerated and may result in students being sent home at their own expense. Students are also expected to report any bullying which they see to an ECI member of staff.

**Integration** - Students are expected to try to integrate with all of the different nationalities and ethnic backgrounds that we have at our centres. Students are also actively encouraged to try to learn as much as possible about the different countries that other students come from.

# STAYING IN A RESIDENCE

## Classes & activities may be held in the mornings or afternoons.

When you arrive you will be told your room number and be given the key card. Don't lose this, as there will be a cost for a replacement key! If you forget your key in your room at any time, don't worry, ask a member of staff to help you. Your room will be cleaned once a week and your sheets and towels will be changed.

All your meals will be in the residence canteen and you will be given a packed lunch when going on excursions at the weekends. In the canteen it is self-service, please always respect the instructions given by staff with regards to queues and meal times.



When not attending class or taking part in activities, you must remain within campus grounds. You must not leave the campus without permission at any time.

Alcohol & Drugs will not be tolerated. Students caught in the possession of either of these will be sent home immediately.

Students are required to attend evening activities organised in the residence. For information about your evening programme please speak to a member of staff.

All residents must leave the building if a fire alarm is sounded.

Tampering with the fire extinguishers or smoke detectors, or setting off a false fire alarm will be cause for severe disciplinary action and a substantial fine.

The residence will be locked at 10.30pm each night.

You must be inside the residence by this time. There are no exceptions to this rule even with permission from parents or guardians.

Bedtime is 11.00pm & lights out at 11.30pm.

Please do not make any noise in your room, corridor or in the shared areas that could disturb other residents.

Residents must take care of all the furniture and fixtures of the residence, & any damage or breakages must be paid for.

Smoking is not permitted.

On arrival in the residence all students will be asked for a deposit of €70, this will be returned to you when you are leaving provided there is no damage.

## RULES

### DO

Carry your student card given to you by the Emerald Cultural Institute. It has all of the contact information for the residence and school.

Stay with your group at all times when out on excursions.

Look right before crossing the road; remember that in Ireland cars travel on the left.

Respect the rules of the residence and always listen to indications given to you by residential supervisors.

Be friendly and polite with your fellow students and with all Emerald staff.

Be punctual for all classes and activities.

### DO NOT

Carry large sums of money with you.

Carry your passport around with you. In Ireland it is not necessary to carry official identification with you.

Go out alone, particularly in the evenings. You CANNOT leave the residence unaccompanied.

Take short cuts or use badly lit laneways. You should only use the main routes as identified by Emerald staff/ Group Leaders.

Buy cigarettes or alcohol. It is illegal for anyone under 18.

Do not enter any premises licensed to sell alcohol. (e.g. Pub)

# TIMETABLE

Classes may be held in the morning or afternoon. On the first day students will be given a tour of the school as well as an orientation of Dublin city centre. Your group leader or tutor will tell you what activity is planned every day.
