LOCATION




Young adult students attend their classes in Alexandra College. The Trinity Hall residence, where young adult students stay, is a short 5 -minute walk away on Dartry road, Dublin 6.

Both are located 5 minutes from Dublin city centre (St Stephen's Green) by tram. Alexandra College is located on the Milltown stop of the Green line Luas(tram).

A gated complex with 24-hour on-site security services and CCTV

Central social and recreational facilities (including TV lounges, quiet reading space, games areas)

24-hour supervision by Emerald residential managers and supervisors.

All your meals are included. At the weekend, you will be provided with a packed lunch on the day of your excursion.

Sheets and towels are provided and changed weekly. Bedrooms will be cleaned during the week.

There are laundry facilities beside the canteen, with coin-operated self-service washing machines and dryers. It is possible to buy washing powder in the residence shop or in the vending machines in reception.

TRANSPORT PASSES

Your transport pass will be provided to you on arrival or on your first morning in Emerald (depending on your arrival schedule).

It is important to carry your transport pass with you at all times to avoid getting a fine on the LUAS (tram). Lost transport passes will only be replaced at an extra cost. This is your own responsibility and we recommend you keep your pass safely in your purse or wallet.

LESSONS & ACTIVITIES

Lessons are 60 minutes long. Classes are Monday to Friday afternoons*.

Evening Activities usually take place every evening from 20.00 to 22.00. Students are expected to return to their apartments by 23.00.

The activities are twice per week. Your tutor will inform you of your scheduled activities.

A number of mornings per week you will have free time.). You are expected to return to Alexandra College for lunch and for your afternoon lessons.

If you have any questions or issues, please speak to your tutor.

TUTORS

You have a tutor both in the residence and in Alexandra College where your classes are held. During the week, you will meet your tutor every day. Your tutor will inform you of your programme and you can talk to them if you have any issues or questions.

RESIDENCE RULES

Alcohol & Drugs will not be tolerated. Students caught in the possession of either of these will be sent home immediately.

Students are required to attend evening activities organised in the residence. For information about your evening programme please speak to your tutor.

All residents must leave the building if a fire alarm is sounded. Tampering with the fire extinguishers or smoke detectors or setting off a false fire alarm will be cause for severe disciplinary action and a substantial fine.

The residence will be locked at 10.30 each night. Students must be in the residence by this time. There are no exceptions to this rule even with permission from parents or guardians.

Bedtime is 11.00pm & lights out at 11.30pm.

Please do not make any noise in your room, corridor or in the shared areas that could disturb other residents.

Residents must take care of all the furniture and fixtures of the residence, & any damage or breakages must be paid for.

Smoking is not permitted and smoking indoors is always prohibited

On arrival in the residence all students will be asked for a deposit of €50, this will be returned to them when they are leaving provided there is no damage or outstanding fine.

Students are provided with room key cards. Lost or broken cards can be replaced by residence staff at a small cost.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance at class is compulsory and is the responsibility of each student.

DRINKING

It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to buy, attempt to buy or consume alcohol in Ireland. It is also illegal to obtain alcohol for anybody below the minimum age. Please be aware of these laws at all times. Students caught drinking or in possession of alcohol will be sent home.

SMOKING

Smoking is banned in all indoor public places in Ireland.

DRUGS

Illicit drug use in Ireland will result in heavy punishments. There are strict laws in Ireland against the use of illegal drugs.

PICKPOCKETS

Be vigilant with your wallet/purse or other valuables particularly when travelling in a group. Don't carry large amounts of cash with you, only carry what you need.

It is not necessary for you to carry your passport with you in Ireland. Instead leave it at home in a safe place. If your wallet/purse or other valuables have been lost or stolen, report all items at the nearest Garda station.

SHOPLIFTING

Shoplifting is not tolerated in Ireland and will result in an arrest and possibly prosecution if an individual is found guilty of shoplifting.

Make sure to watch some Irish sport – Gaelic Football, Hurling and Rugby all make for an exciting afternoon!



GENERAL & PRACTICAL INFORMATION

MEDICAL INFORMATION

All students studying in Ireland should obtain appropriate medical insurance in their own country before departure. Students travelling from EU countries should bring their European Health Insurance with them. Non-EU students should bring a copy of their insurance policy with them when travelling.

Our on-site team will be happy to assist with making the arrangements for students who require medical attention. We would ask that parents or group leaders inform us at the time of booking about any conditions or relevant medical information which we should be aware of, so we can inform our staff.

Students should cover the cost of transport if required for any medical visits. Group leaders are required to accompany their students to doctors/hospitals and for individual junior students a member of our staff will accompany and stay them.



A deposit of €50 is charged to all residential students and is payable on arrival. The deposit will be refunded provided that no damage has been caused.

In the event that a student causes damage to property we will deduct the cost of the damages from the total amount. The Institute reserves the right to recover the cost for exceptional cleaning.

SMOKING/ ALCOHOL/ ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Smoking is prohibited in all dorms and campus buildings. Students caught smoking in the apartments or campus buildings can be subject to expulsion as they have breached the fire safety regulations of the campus.

The minimum age for buying and consuming alcohol in Ireland is 18 years and many public houses allow only over 21s. Any student found in possession of alcohol, drugs or other illegal substances may be asked to leave the school.



HEALTH & SAFETY

As part of their welcome orientation students and group leaders are required to attend a briefing on the safety regulations. The briefing includes an introduction to life on the campus, security of personal property and fire safety. Because of the importance of fire safety attendance is compulsory.

Group leaders and students will also receive details of first aid procedures, which they should follow in the event of an accident.


EMERALD STUDENT IDENTITY CARD

All students are issued with an Emerald Cultural Institute student ID card on their arrival. Students should carry their student ID with them at all times and may be asked to produce the card by the security or residential staff.

SAFETY

We advise all students not to carry large amounts of cash, ID or travel documents on their person during their stay.





STUDENT SUPERVISION

Our team of residential managers, supervisors and activity staff are on hand to care for the welfare of students. Students will be introduced to this team on the first day. Our staff do their utmost to ensure that every aspect of students' stay with us is enjoyable.
